Puffin Parade

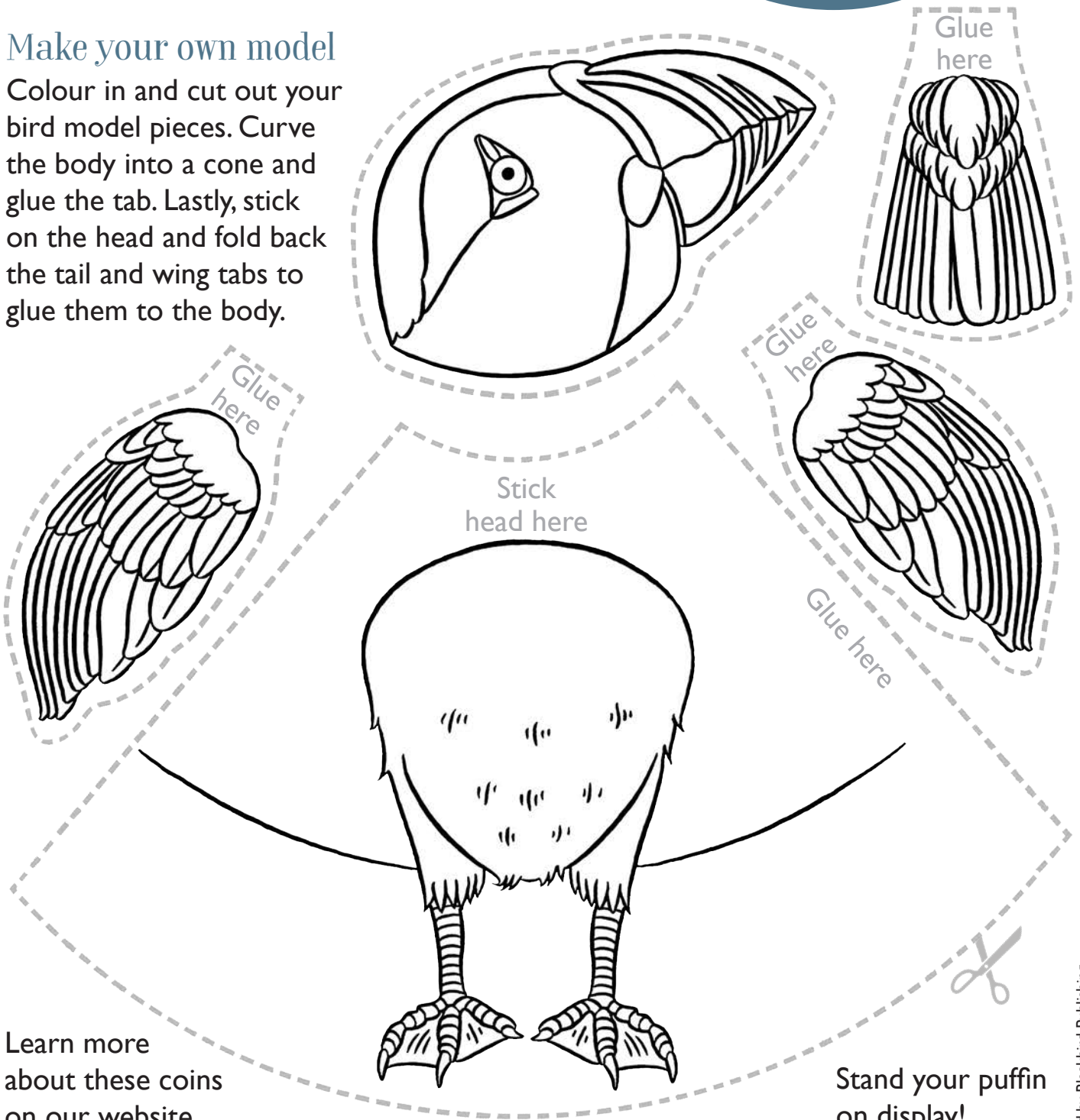


Have fun making your own puffin model inspired by the new 20 pence coin – part of the set of British wildlife conservation themed coins of King Charles III.

Did you know?
Puffins spend the winter out on the open sea of the cold northern oceans. They return to rocky islands or coastal clifftops to nest in the spring. Puffins are nicknamed ‘sea parrots’ because they have bright red bills. They feed on small fish and can dive deep underwater to catch prey.

Make your own model

Colour in and cut out your bird model pieces. Curve the body into a cone and glue the tab. Lastly, stick on the head and fold back the tail and wing tabs to glue them to the body.
